

Workshop on Clinical Care for Sexual Assault Survivors & Evaluation (CCSAS)

North of Lebanon - February 14 & 15, 2013

Call for participation

In partnership with ABAAD-Resource Center for Gender Equality, the International Medical Corps (IMC) in coordination & support of UNHCR is planning to conduct a two-full day's workshop on CCSAS over February 14 & 15, 2013 in North of Lebanon (Venue TBD).

The workshop aims at strengthening the capacities and improving the quality of clinical care for sexual assault survivors among Syrian refugees' population.

The training will be introducing the participants to the **CCSAS pathway, different stages of direct patient care, how to prepare the clinic and conduct the forensic evidence collection.**

3. Working with refugee population.

It’s also a huge public health problem, because it leads to issues such as sexually transmitted disease, unwanted pregnancies which can be problem not only for the woman but also for the unborn child. It leads to HIV. It leads to stigma of the woman who has been raped.”
